The 2010 ShelterBox Challenge is made up of 10 sections – one for each year that ShelterBox has been operating. To gain the challenge you need to complete at least 8 of the sections below. There is one extra section to give you more options.

Challenge Number	Month	Theme	Challenge Details	Done ?
1	March	Global	This is an introduction to who ShelterBox are and what they do. Complete the “Where in the World” activity (continents and countries where SB has worked) Complete the “Operation ShelterBox” activity (responding to a disaster – Earthquake in Pakistan) - We did these at Scouts on Weds 24 th March. If you missed them then you can catch up on the web site.	
2	May	Shelter	Build a Shelter (that is big enough for 10 people if possible). We will do this at Scouts on the Scout Skills nights in May and June.	
3	June	Big Green Box Week	Take part in the ShelterBox Scavenger Hunt in London on Saturday June 12 th . Scouts need to raise at least £2.70	
4	July	Fitness	Take part in a sponsored event to raise money for ShelterBox. The options are a sponsored hike (we will organise), swim or cycle (you organise). This also counts towards the Fitness Challenge.	
5	September	Cooking	Cook a meal associated with one of the countries where SB has worked. We will do this at Scouts, or you could do it at home as part of your Chef Badge.	
6	October	Water Conservation	Find out about a reservoir or water treatment plant.	
			Find out how important water is and think about water conservation.	
7	December	Creative	Make a Christmas decoration in the SB colours (green and yellow).	
			Take part in the carol singing evening on the last meeting of term.	
8	Whenever	Camping	Attend a Scout camp. Discuss what it would be like to lose everything and what it would mean to be given a 10 man tent to live in, also what it would be like to live in a tent for six months.	
9	Whenever	Photography	Take an unusual photograph that somehow relates to; disasters, humanitarian aid or ShelterBox. Hand in the photo and it can be displayed on the website and maybe sent to ShelterBox.	
10	Whenever	Community	Make bird boxes. These will provide shelter and warmth for birds in your community.	
			Design a poster that promotes ShelterBox and The Scouts Association’s partnership.	
11	Whenever	Awareness	Design a poster that raises awareness of ShelterBox and what they do.	
			Encourage people to join the 100 Club in aid of ShelterBox.
